

Travel Identification Requirements

If the wish involves travel, please review the following document to ensure you have appropriate identification for your specific method of travel. Photocopies of IDs for all wish participants must be provided to Make-A-Wish Eastern North Carolina.

Automobile

The driver(s) of the vehicle must have a valid driver's license issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV).

Airplane (Domestic)

Per requirements issued by the Transportation Security Administration (TSA), adult passengers age 18 and over must show one of the following at the airport checkpoint in order to travel. TSA does not require children under 18 to provide identification when traveling with a companion within the United States.

- Driver's license or other state photo identity card issued by Department of Motor Vehicles (or equivalent)
- U.S. passport
- U.S. passport card
- DHS trusted traveler card (Global Entry, NEXUS, SENTRI, FAST)
- U.S. military ID (active duty or retired military and their dependents, and DoD civilians)
- Permanent resident card
- Border crossing card
- DHS-designated enhanced driver's license
- Airline or airport-issued ID (if issued under a TSA-approved security plan)
- Federally recognized, tribal-issued photo ID
- HSPD-12 PIV card
- Foreign government-issued passport
- Canadian provincial driver's license or Indian and Northern Affairs Canada card
- Transportation worker identification credential
- Immigration and Naturalization Service Employment Authorization Card (I-766)

Airplane (International)

A U.S. or foreign government-issued passport is required for passengers of any age.

Train

Passengers age 18 and older must show:

- One piece of photo identification issued by a government authority, OR
- Two pieces of identification, at least one of which is issued by a government authority

Examples of acceptable forms of ID include:

- State or provincial driver's license
- Passport
- Official government-issued identification (federal, state, city or county government or foreign government)
- Canadian provincial health card ID card with photo
- Military photo ID
- Student identification (university, college or high school photo ID)
- Job Corps photo ID

Cruise Ship

Make-A-Wish Eastern North Carolina requires that all wish participants travel with passport books on cruises. If you are a non-U.S. citizen, you must present a valid passport, an original copy of your Alien Registration Card, and in some cases, a visa. Additional guidelines may exist for U.S. lawful permanent residents and Canadian Landed Immigrants, children whose last names differ from that of the parent they are traveling with, and international cruises—please consult your wish coordinator.

Bus

Passengers age 18 and older must show either a driver's license OR a passport.

Note: If any wish participant is residing in the United States without legal immigration paperwork, Make-A-Wish Eastern North Carolina cannot guarantee their safe travel, nor can we prevent or intercede in a deportation process. Participants without legal immigration paperwork assume any deportation risks associated with travel by aircraft, automobile, train, bus, or other method of transportation.
